In lots of ways, we've had digital media at our full disposal for a good 3 decades. But as we've gotten smarter the apps have, too — and they're easier to use.

Ben Pollock takes a 2025 look at websites, social media, mass emails and engaging with local news media. First, an example: how the University of Arkansas's AEA chapter organized opposition last year to an administration plan to privatize over 200 custodial and groundskeeping employees.

These employees got to keep their seniority and benefits.

 >33,600 students. Union membership?
- Public Employees, Public Education can unionize according to state constitution but no collective bargaining, no meeting

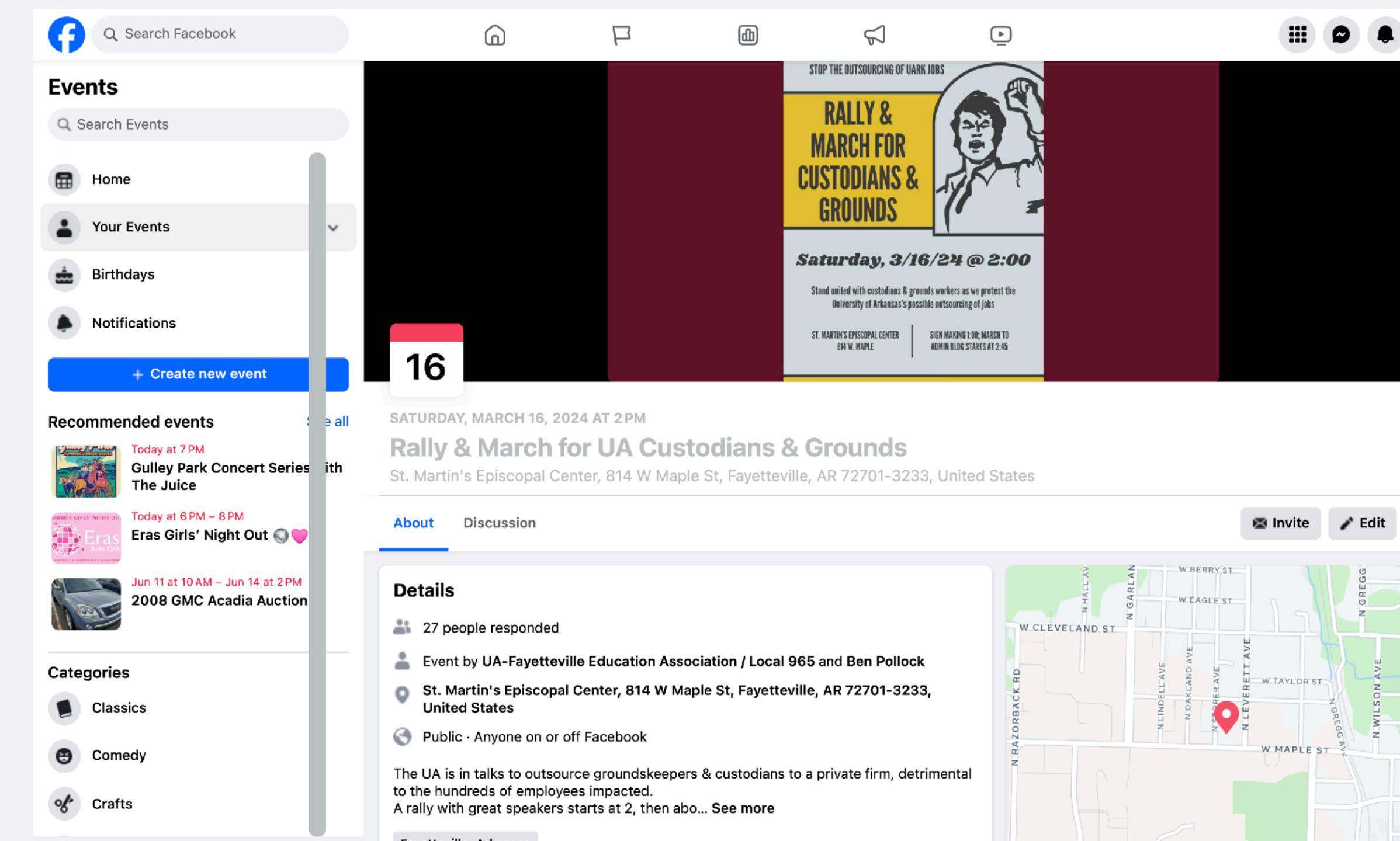
- on campus during work hours, no recruiting on campus during work hours
